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Richard Talbot of the Province of Maryland and in the County of
ann arundell Situating in West River Planters, being of good
and perfect memory Do constitute ordain and appoint this
my last Will and Testament in manner as followeth.

Imp: I do give and bequeath unto my Eldest Son Richard
this lot of Land I now live upon (called Propter Ance) —
with a piece of Land Lying on the South Side of the South
branch and on the South Side of West River (called Talbots timber
now) but in case John Baldwin refuses it, then it to be
as aforesaid —

I do also give and bequeath unto my other two sons Edw.
and John all that parcell of Land being three hundred acres
(called Talbots Edge) only Edw to have his first (Heir)
Provided that he begin at Either End, and if Either of them
shall dye before they come to age then his or their part —
to be Equally divided to the other two.

I also give and bequeath unto my Son and Daughter —
Elizabeth three Cows to be for their use and benefit. —
Namely the Cow called Spott and Dye Horses, and young
Goutles with their Increase Male and female, to be
tended before Evidence for their use immediately, after
my decease but to remain with their mother till they come
to age, the Boy att Twenty one, and the Girl att Sixteen
or at age —

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And I do also give which were given to my Eldest Son Richard
and Edw by their Grandfather, I do give them all the
Male (ain) which shall hereafter be of the said (Cattle).
I do also give unto my Wife the use of my Plantation
I now live on, so long as she lieth, but in case she marry
then to have it till she cometh to age. I do also constitute
ordain and appoint my loving Wife my true and law-
full Executor as witness my hand and Seal this 21 day
of the 2^d Month (called April) 1663.

Letters administracō issued accordingly Ino. 10. 1663

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I Woodman Stockely being in health and perfect
memory and intending to pass out of the Country not knowing
how the Lord may or will dispose of me I have thought fitt
to make my will as followeth

(First)
